

## Directions to Workshop Locations

### **Blair Park, Williston (VT Technical College campus)**

I-89, Exit 12 – at end of ramp (light) turn on Route 2A going toward Tafts Corners. Proceed through 3 traffic lights and through the junction of Routes 2 and 2A. Take the second left after the junction, watch for a sign on the left that says “Blair Park.” Then take the first left. Vermont Technical College will be straight ahead. Room 401A is on the front (Route 2A) side of the building.

### **Green Mt. Coffee Roasters Training Facility, Waterbury**

I-89, Exit 10 – Head toward the junction of Route 2E/100S and take left at the T in the road. You will be on Main Street in Waterbury. Go through two traffic lights. Take a left just after the Sunoco station (on left) onto Demeritt Place. Continue over the train tracks and 81 Demeritt Place is the building in front of you on the left hand side. Enter the front doors; the training room is to the left in the back.

### **Howard Dean Center, Springfield**

I-91, Exit 7 - (Springfield), to Route 11 West. In about 3 miles, make a left onto South Street at the second blinking light at sharp bend before downtown. Go up South Street about 1 mile, to Springfield High School and the Howard Dean Education Center, located at the far end of the high school. Park around back. Room 207 is inside entrance on left.

### **Charles E. Carter Business Resource Center, St. Johnsbury**

I-91, Exit 23 – turn onto Route 5 South, go about 1 mile, turn right onto Industrial Park Road. Take first right. Carter Center (red and white building) is on right.

### **U.S. Forest Service, Rutland**

The facility is about 1 mile north of the junction of Route 7 and Route 4 on Route 7 (also N. Main Street). The address is 231 N. Main Street.
